

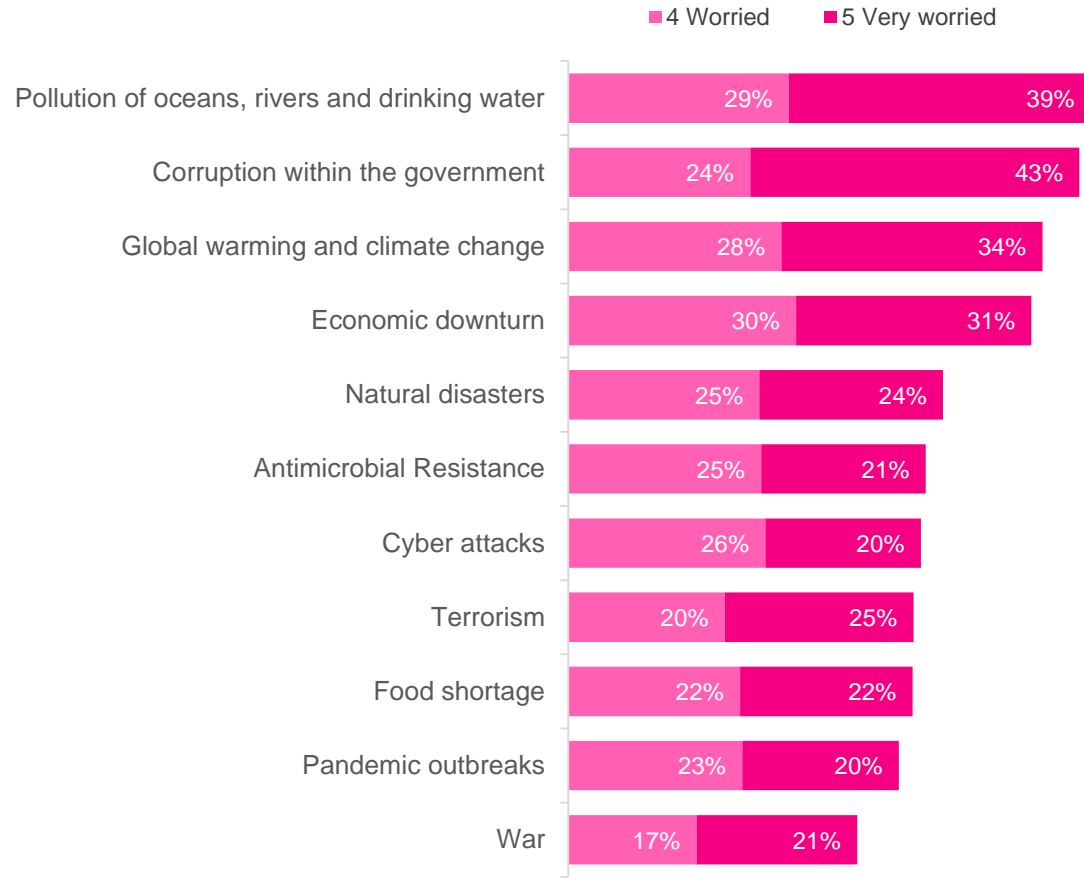

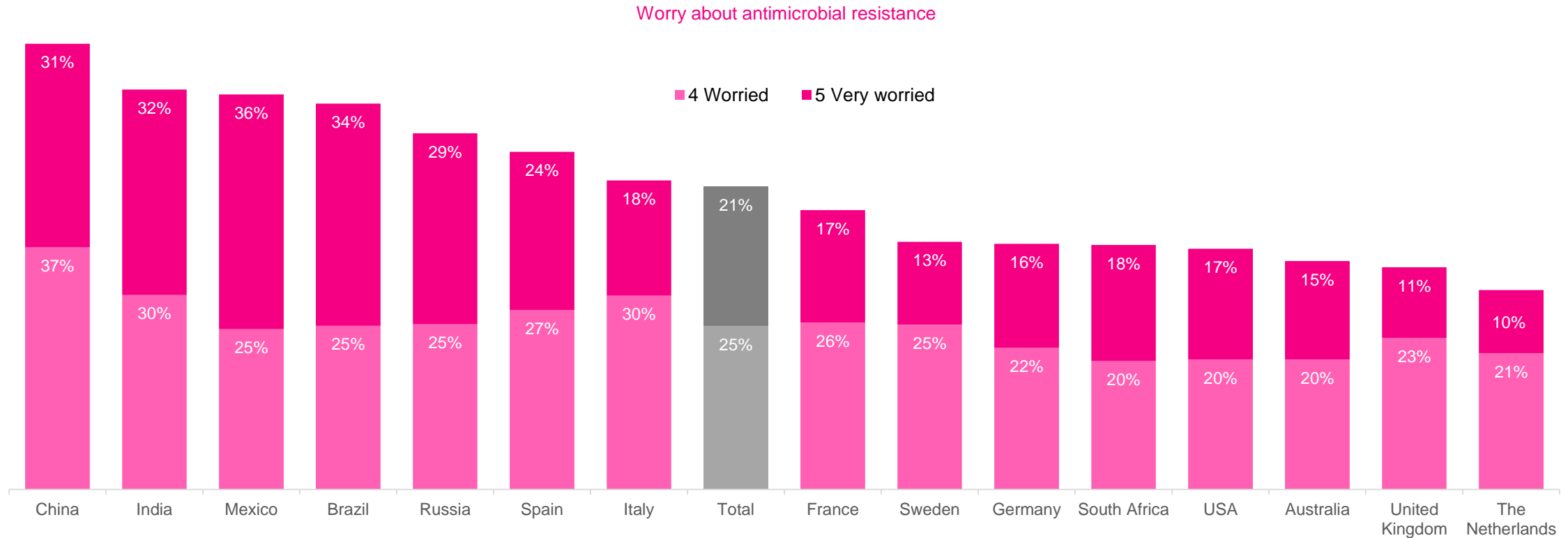

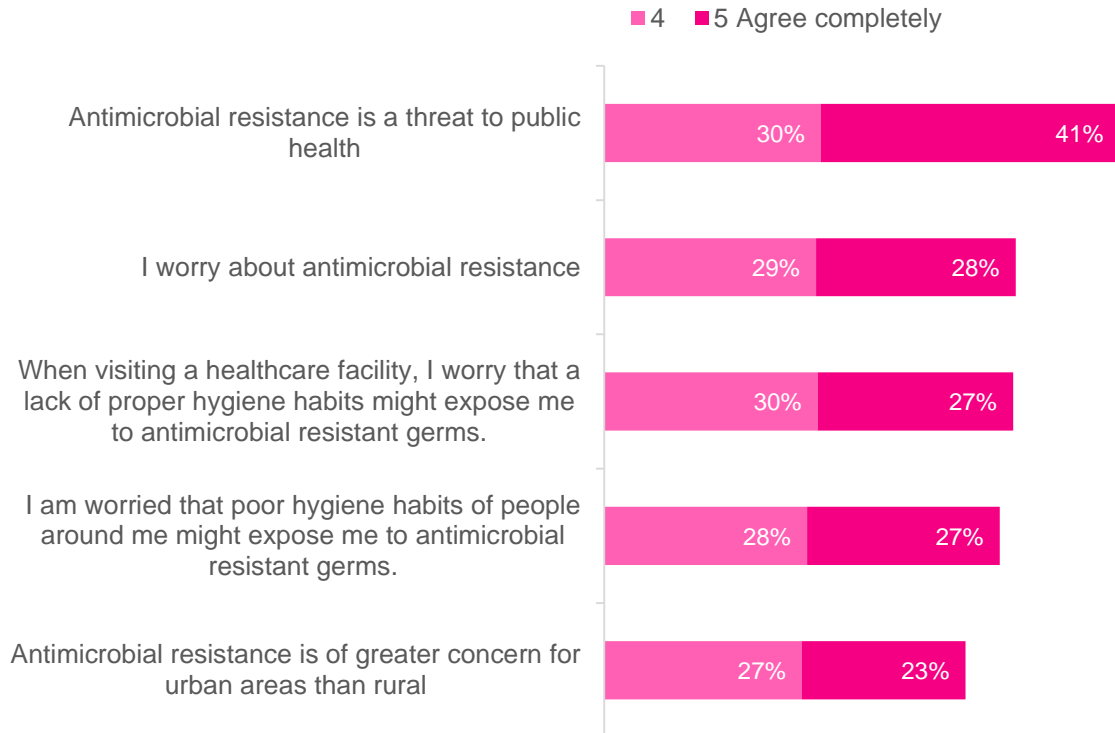
Pollution of oceans, rivers and drinking water is perceived to be the greatest threat to public health



China, India and Mexico are most worried about antimicrobial resistance



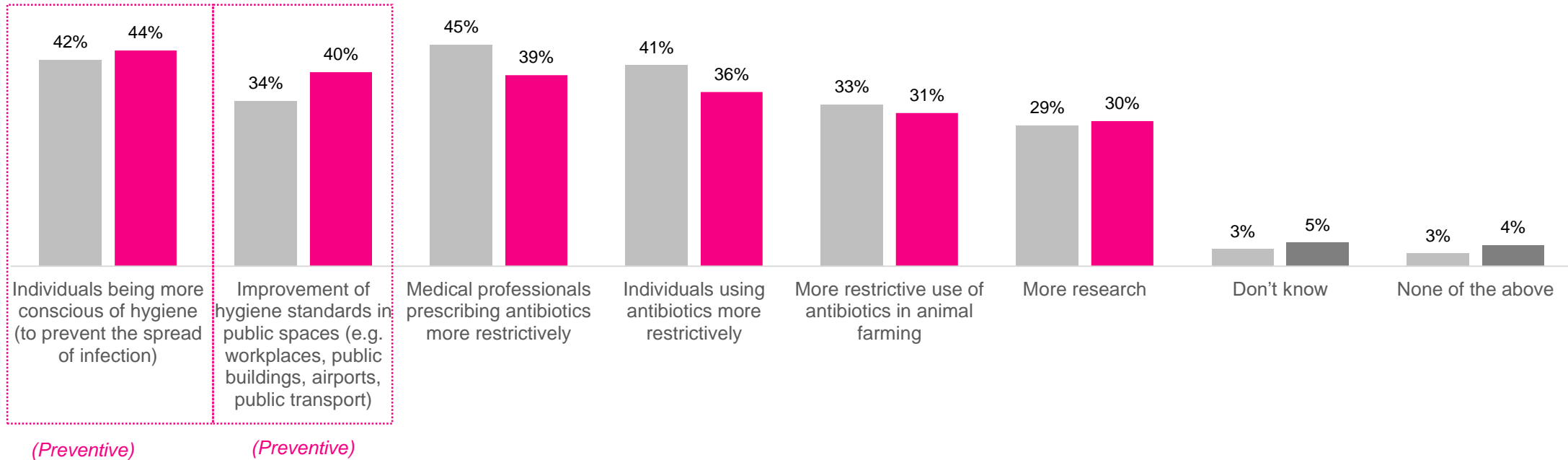
More than half worry that the lack of proper hygiene habits at hospitals might expose them to antimicrobial resistant germs
